Welcome to The Brook Theatre! We are excited to present this year's Fall Play "Lend Me A Tenor"!

Winner of 3 Tony Awards and 4 Drama Desk Awards, Lend Me A Tenor is set in September 1934. Saunders, the general manager of the Cleveland Grand Opera Company, is primed to welcome world-famous singer Tito Merelli, known as Il Stupendo, the greatest tenor of his generation, to appear for one night only as the star of the opera. Tito arrives late, and through a hilarious series of mishaps, he is given a double dose of tranquilizers and passes out. His pulse is so low that Saunders and his assistant Max believe he's dead - and in a frantic attempt to salvage the evening, Saunders persuades Max to get into Merelli's costume and fool the audience into thinking he's Il Stupendo. Max succeeds and lives up to his idol, but Merelli regains consciousness and gets into the identical costume, ready to perform. Now two opera singers are running around in the same costume and two women are running around in lingerie, each thinking she is with Il Stupendo. A sensation on Broadway and in London's West End, this madcap, screwball comedy is guaranteed to leave audiences teary-eyed with laughter. Thank you for coming and **ENJOY THE SHOW!**

About the Playwright

Ken Ludwig is a two-time Olivier Award-winning playwright who has written over 26 plays and musicals, including 6 shows on Broadway and 7 in London's West End. His first Broadway play, Lend Me A Tenor, won two Tony Awards and was called "one of the classic comedies of the 20th century" by The Washington Post. His other awards include the Helen Hayes Award, the 2017 Samuel French Award for Sustained Excellence in the American Theatre, the Edgar Award for Best Mystery of the Year, and the Edwin Forrest Award for Contributions to the American Theater. His book How To Teach Your Children Shakespeare, published by Penguin/Random House, won the Falstaff Award for Best Shakespeare Book of the Year, and his essays are published by the Yale Review. Ken's best known works include Crazy For You (5 years on Broadway, Tony and Olivier Awards for Best Musical), Lend Me A Tenor, Moon Over Buffalo, The Game's Afoot, Baskerville, Sherwood, A Fox on the Fairway, and a stage version of Murder on the Orient Express, written expressly at the request of the Agatha Christie Estate. His newest play, The Gods of Comedy, premieres in 2019 at The McCarter Theater in Princeton and The Old Globe Theatre in San Diego. On Broadway and the West End, his plays have starred Alec Baldwin, Carol Burnett, Tony Shalhoub, Lynn Redgrave and Joan Collins. He holds degrees from Harvard, where he studied music with Leonard Bernstein, Haverford College and Cambridge University. His work has been performed in over 30 countries in more than 20 languages, and is produced somewhere in the United States and abroad every night of the year. www.kenludwig.com

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Comedies are the most difficult of plays to find, I've come to realize. Good comedies, even more so. In my long search for finding a comedy to grace our stage, I developed two categories that most scripts would fall into: "outdated" or "inappropriate."

A middle ground seemed to be nonexistent. I wanted a comedy to be approachable and fun for our young artists, as well as appropriate for our audience members and community. Thankfully, I believe we finally found it in the show you're about to see.

Lend Me a Tenor struck every right chord as I read it and as I kept thinking about it. When I discovered I was constantly comparing other potential scripts against LMAT, I knew I had found the right play for us. A little zany, a little heartfelt, a little risqué, and a lot of laughter. I would laugh out loud while reading the script, and as the cast can attest, I even cracked up during our rehearsal process. I apologize in advance for my cackling during the show (not really).

I'm so incredibly proud of the company this year -- a pride that continues to blossom the more we do this. Our actors have risen to new levels of artistry and professionalism, our crew has ascended to new levels of creativity and leadership. Every year, the love and passion for our theatre program at BHS increases, and it is 100% due to our students. I know I speak for all of us when I say that we do this for them. They inspire and motivate us.

I'm excited to see where our program will go from here, and I'm eternally grateful to our faculty -- Mr. Wayne, Ms. Osborne, Mr. Rupsis, Mr. Egizio, Ms. Minarich, Ms. Badakhshanian, and the rest of faculty that help us in immeasurable ways. I'm thankful for our theatre booster organization and all of our parent volunteers that put in countless hours to make these productions what they are. We continue to strive to not be "just another high school theatre program." Thank you to Dr. Pascavage, the BHS building administration, district administration, and the VVSD school board for their continued support as we push the boundaries of high school theatre and prepare students for careers in the arts.

Of course, a huge thank you to my wife, Jen, for putting up with the late nights and long hours for two months out of the year. This production is a result of your patience, support, and compassion. As we're about to welcome our first child into this world, I'm already excited that theatre is going to be a part of his life.
